This term we will be exploring what it means to be have belief in ourselves and others. We will learn what it means to be resilient and that this quality is important to help us be the best we can be. We will work together on collaborative projects such as designing and building simple structures.

Growth Mindset

We will continue to develop our growth mindset by believing in ourselves and learning from experience. We will continue to embrace the power of yet and give everything a try. We will develop our understanding of resilience and work together in collaboration towards a shared goal.

Mathematics

Number – multiplication and division

 recall and use multiplication and division facts for the 2, 5 and 10 multiplication tables, including recognising odd and even numbers

- calculate mathematical statements for multiplication and division within the multiplication tables and write them using the multiplication (x), division (÷) and equals (=) signs

- show that multiplication of two numbers can be done in any order (commutative) and division of one number by another cannot

Measurement – money

-recognise and use symbols for pounds (£) and pence (p); combine amounts to make a particular value

-solve simple problems in a practical context involving addition and subtraction of money of the same unit, including giving change

<u>Geometry – properties of shape</u>

-compare and sort common 2-D and 3-D shapes and everyday objects

-identify and describe the properties of 3-D shapes, including the number of edges, vertices and faces

-identify 2-D shapes on the surface of 3-D shapes, [for example, a circle on a cylinder and a triangle on a pyramid]

Art, DT & Music

ART

We will be using an artist for our focus across the spring term. Melissa McCracken is a synesthete; a person who can see colour as she listens to music. She uses this to paint with texture, whilst exploring the relationship between colour and mood. We will explore tints and shades, leading to creating our own pieces inspired by her work.

DT

Using everyday materials (linked to science) we will design and create a new product for the Wicked Witch to use. We will explore joining and linking structures for stability, as well as evaluating our products.

PE -

Dance and Gymnastics

This term we will be learning how to perform a sequence of movements in a routine, as well as using equipment in different ways.



RSHE

This half term we will be learning about Celebrating differences. We will consider amongst other aspects: -

- Self-identity online and offline
- Sense of sense
- Stereotypes boys and girls
- Similarities and differences

English

Speaking and Listening

This half term we will continue to build upon our ability to listen and respond appropriately to adults and their peers by thinking carefully before we speak and questioning if our questions are relevant to extend our understanding and knowledge. Talking is a huge part of how we learn and by taking part in discussions we are able to develop our vocabulary, understanding, imaginations and viewpoints.

Reading This half term we will be continue to explore learning opportunities via our key texts, getting to know them really well and understanding the any new vocabulary we are presented with. We will be building our fluency and ability to add expression within our guided reading groups and during the times we get to read to ourselves in class. By continuing to embrace reading, we will develop confidence and fluency in our word building, identify and develop our own opinions as a reader and develop our understanding why certain books are structured in different ways.

Writing (half term focus; story writing, poetry, non-fiction writing and editing skills)

This half term we will continue to develop a positive attitude towards writing and build our stamina to write for longer periods. We will explore writing for different purposes via story writing, letters and factual based writing. We will plan our writing before we write it, either verbally or by writing ideas down using new vocabulary we have learnt. We will edit our writing by re-reading to check it makes sense to us and the reader and make simple additions and changes to improve it.

Computing - This half term we will exploring algorithms and creating and using a set of simple instructions. We will talk about errors and think carefully about the behaviour of simple programs.

Science - Everyday Materials

We will be identifying and comparing the suitability of everyday materials and how they can be used for particular purposes. We will explore how shapes of some solid materials can be changed by stretching, squashing and bending etc.

Foundation Subjects

Geography - map skills

We will be identifying and uses simple picture maps from our key text, following routes and using simple compass directions. We will make a map of a journey we take and record this in a simple way.

History

We will be using our key texts to explore historical enquiry – asking questions about the past and the jobs that women did during the First World War. This includes the postal service, and other roles that usually fall to the men. We will be learning about ways in which we can find out about the past from pictures, stories and websites etc.

RE

This half term our focus is Judaism. We will be learning to recall and name beliefs, ways of life and festivals in the Judaism calendar and find out the meanings behind them. We will explore where Jews worship and what the Torah is, as well as exploring what Jews believe about the Messiah.
