We have been learning

Africa (Year R)	This week in Africa class we have begun to look at butterfly life cycles, in anticipation of some caterpillars being delivered to the classroom next week! We have read non-fiction books about butterflies and have created symmetrical butterflies with paint. We have read 'The Very Hungry Caterpillar' by Eric Carle and have made our own paperchain caterpillars. In Maths we have been learning double number facts and have used Numicon and Ten Frames to help support this. In French we have been learning the names of clothes and we are able to say in what weather conditions we would wear these clothes.
Asia (Year 1)	What a lovely first week back we've had. As part of our Percy topic we have decided to research British wild animals and create fact files about them. This week we have been learning all about fact files, identifying their features and thinking about how the information is presented. In Maths we have been exploring numbers to 100, demonstrating our knowledge in presenting these numbers in various ways using lots of different resources. In PE we have been practising our running and throwing skills in preparation for sports day. In Geography we talked about dangerous weathers and discussed sun safety, creating posters about keeping safe in the sun. Next week the class will be completing their National Phonics Screening Check which we are sure they will all do really well with. These results will be fed back to you at the end of term.
Europe (Year 2)	Welcome back! The final half term is fully underway and we have had a lovely first week back. In PE on Monday, we welcomed Coach Marcus from Sports Stars. He is going to be teaching us rugby skills each week and our first session was so fun! We learnt to do a swing pass and a pop pass. Mrs. Hutchings is learning new skills too! On Tuesday, we started to practise for our sports day and to say we are excited is an under-statement! In Geography, we had the opportunity to use atlases. We are learning to compare a Non-European country to the UK. We are exploring Kenya, in Africa. We used the atlases to locate Kenya and begin to learn about its environment. We kicked off our new learning journey 'Everything Changes' by exploring some inventions that have changed over time. We can't wait to find out more. Bring on the final leg of Year 2!
Australasia (Year 3)	As part of our changing world's unit, we have begun a new writing unit – biography writing. We are writing about David Attenborough. In music we are developing our proficiency on the recorder - learning to switch between notes more readily. In computing we began a computing unit looking at ways to use input devices to trigger events. We are enhancing our locational knowledge in geography making comparisons between Horsham and our focus town – Hebden Bridge. In PE we are playing tag rugby and enjoying the sport very much.
Antarctica (Year 4)	Well, here we go for the final half term of Year 4 and the children have made a cracking start this week. We have continued to read the Explorer by Katherine Rundell and used it to plan our next piece of writing – a journal entry as one of the characters from the book. In maths, we have fully focused our revising and preparing for the multiplication check. The children did an amazing job in completing this – Well done Year 4! In science, the children have been creating Knowledge organisers to share our knowledge of electricity. In PE, children have begun the athletics practice for Sports Day. In Geography, the children compared different types of rainforests

	(tropical and temperate) and in computing children completed their photo editing work by creating a 'fake photo' which they children had a lot of fun doing.
North America (Year 5)	We are back and raring to go for the final half term of the year! We have started to think about our next piece of writing in English, a persuasive text that links to balance in the environment and the importance of the oceans. In maths, we recapped the short division method and looked at how we can approach word problems linked to multiplication and division. In PE, the children thoroughly enjoyed a session with Mr Ryan practicing track and field events for the upcoming Sports Day. The children also had a great time with Mr Meaney, who is running a 3-sesson Sports Leadership programme, giving the children an understanding of how to set up and run activities for others. In art, we practiced our sketching techniques as a starting point for producing a piece inspired by a poster with the heading 'A new species invades the ocean'.
South America (Year 6)	What a great first week to our final half term together. In maths, we have been learning about pie charts. We have been reading, interpreting them and constructing them from given sets of data. In English our focus has been around water week. We have been researching the issues surrounding water pollution and scarcity and then used this to write a persuasive letter to the government or water companies to get them to do more to improve things. In science, we investigated yeast and took part in a 'yeast race' to see how much dough would rise in different conditions. In history we have continued our topic of the ancient Egyptians and learnt about the Book of the Dead and in computing we started to learn how to code a program and upload it onto a piece of hardware called a micro:bit.

Childcare vouchers

From September, we will no longer be able to accept childcare vouchers in lieu of payment for trips, residentials or clubs provided by an outside company/provider.

Vouchers can be used to pay for breakfast club. Any club run by an outside provider, will have to register to accept the vouchers in their own right, we are not able to accept them on their behalf.

What can childcare vouchers be used for?

You can use childcare vouchers to pay for Ofsted-registered or approved childcare facilities or practitioners. The provider needs to be regulated and has to accept childcare vouchers. Childcare providers don't have to accept vouchers as a form of payment, even if they're registered.

Services and places included in the scheme can include childminders, nannies, after-school clubs, breakfast clubs, holiday clubs and wrap-around care.

What can childcare vouchers NOT be used for?

School trips during school hours or related to the school curriculum. Residential trips that take place away from the school's registered premises
