There have been some very exciting moments this week at school that have helped to bring our curriculum and learning alive at Rudgwick. Year 6 enjoyed some visitors from the Rikkyo School. Some of the students from our neighbouring school shared a project they have been working on in their Computing lessons, in which they have designed a model to solve a problem, in this case to clear litter. It was a very innovative idea and our children enjoyed seeing their presentation. Year 6 then had the chance to share the games that they have been programming using *Scratch* with our visitors and much fun and 'games' was

enjoyed by all.





As part of their 'People who help us' topic, Year 1 had a nurse visit them on Thursday afternoon. They learnt about the important role that nurses play in hospitals and the community and had the chance to ask some of the questions that they had written and prepared. They were lucky enough to have a go 'playing' with various medical supplies included bandages and syringes. The class are working on creating a non-fiction book about people who help us and will have several more visitors coming in over the next few weeks. Finally this week, on Tuesday evening, members of the Year 6 book club attended the











Weald Book Awards. This was a wonderful evening, where they got to see their work displayed, and listen to the visiting authors talk about their books. The pupils were amazing and we received an award in every category. We even won a trophy for the much-coveted best trailer award. At the end of the evening the children were able to get their books signed and have photographs taken. Mrs Hoyte is incredibly proud of how hard they have worked in book club and all of the interesting discussions and debates that have taken place. It was great to see this hard work rewarded on Tuesday with an inspiring celebration of all things reading and writing.

We have been learning

Africa (Year R)	This week in Africa class we have been reading a book about a green-caped crusader called Michael Recycle by Ellie Bethel. Michael Recycle helps to look after planet Earth by reducing, reusing and recycling. We have written thank you letters to Michael to thank him for everything he does. In Maths this week we have been learning about length and height. We have ordered ourselves from the shortest to the tallest and have measured objects around the classroom using Unifx cubes and our own feet! We have also been amazing artists this week by creating our own paintings inspired by the work of Claude Monet.
Asia (Year 1)	It's been another great week in Asia Class. We have been writing the first page of our People Who Help Us books, thinking about who help us in our lives. In Maths we have been exploring standard and non-standard units of measure for height and length, using comparative language. On Thursday we were very lucky to be visited by a real life nurse. We asked questions

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	and used this information to write the next page of our People Who Help Us books. In PE we have been exploring movement in gymnastics thinking carefully about movement and jumping. We had another lovely lesson with Mrs Eames, learning how to strum up and down the strings.
Europe (Year 2)	What a week! So much lovely learning going on! In English, we used our core text to write descriptive sentences in a list, using commas and bullet points and wrote from personal experience. We also published our acrostic poems and they look simply wonderful. In maths, we looked at finding thirds, naming fractions, making a whole and counting in halves and quarters. Phew! In science, we had great fun planting our sweet pea seeds and look forward to taking care of them so they grow!
Australasia (Year 3)	Maths: This week we used picture methods, written methods and physical resources to learn the column method of addition and subtraction. We restricted calculations to those were there are no exchanges. English: We sequenced a story from a known text, used the text to extend our vocabulary and began to plan our own retelling of the story. PE: in swimming, the children are making good progress and in gymnastics they are using apparatus to create sequences of balances and developing their appreciation of how to stay safe when using apparatus. In art, we evaluated our dragon eye project and considered the skills they utilised in the project. In Computing the children learned how questions which can only be answered with a 'yes' or a 'no' are an aid to problem solving. Such questions help people sort and sift through possible answers. In RE, the children looked at Jesus as a historical figure ready for their learning about miracle stories in the Bible.
Antarctica (Year 4)	This week in Antarctica we have continued learning about shape in maths with a focus on angles and lines of symmetry. In English, we have focused on letter writing to inform others through our history learning about Henry 8 th and his plans to leave and reform the church. We have also thought about what kind of king he was. In science, we have learnt about the human digestive system and how it works. In RE, we have been learning about the teaching of Jesus through his parables. In music we have continued to improve with our clarinets by playing more notes successfully. In Woodland learning the children enjoyed learning different skills of charcoal sketching and whittling. In PE, we have begun a new dance unit focusing on a key character from our book Varjak Paw.
North America (Year 5)	Another great week in North America despite some of the gloomy weather. The children were showing off their skills in gymnastics to start the week, showing superb focus and really impressing Coach Jay in their opening session. We have been focusing on the link between fractions, percentages and decimals this week in maths, utilising our knowledge of equivalent fractions to support us. In English, the children have written and edited their fights scenes thinking carefully about how different sentence types can affect the pace of their narratives. We enjoyed a sunny session for woodland learning, continuing to improve our whittling skills and drawing with coal as well as researching information about the Vikings in history.
South America (Year 6)	This week in South America class we have been motoring through our learning in maths and have covered volume and finding the mean. In English we have finished reading The Land of Neverbelieve and have started to plan and draft our own areas on the island. I am excited for how these pieces of writing will turn out as the children's ideas are brilliant. In science we have learnt about how animals are adapted to suit their environment and in PE we have started our coaching sessions in gymnastics and also continued with the next decade of the 1990s in dance.

In computing we have started our next unit all about computer systems and networks and in RE we have been looking at how free will and determination are linked to Jesus' death.
