# We have been learning

Africa	The week began with a real treat as we got to watch the KS2 show,

	Reception class. To celebrate we toasted marshmallows, ate smores and
	drank hot chocolate. In Maths we have been using part-whole models,
	Numicon and ten frames to find all of the number bonds for the numbers 5-
	10. Mrs Hutchings worked with us this week to make some really amazing
	paintings of sunflowers, using water-based and acrylic paints. Only 1 week

	left to go until our Reception year is over; Mrs Worth and Mrs Knight are going to make sure it is a wonderful one to remember.
Asia (Year 1)	It's been such a lovely week. We loved watching the dress rehearsal of Treasure Island on Monday – KS2 and especially Year 6 did so well! And what an amazing Percy Day we had! We had the best fun learning all about the birds of prey, seeing baby owls and even getting the chance to hold an owl. We also painted pebble woodland creatures before going out on our own Percy treasure hunt and finding our treasure – ice pops. In English we have been exploring poetry by reading The Lost Words. We shared listened to lots of different poems before voting on our favourite. We then created our own actions for the poem Adder.
Europe (Year 2)	We have had a really lovely week this week in Year 2. We have spent time reflecting on friendships and how we should treat others, as well as putting all our maths skills to use to complete arithmetic questions involving the four operations. In English, we had fun exploring the book 'Changes' by Anthony Browne. We used it to help us predict outcomes and ask and answer inference questions – we are really getting to grips with this! In Art, we referred back to an artist we learnt about in the Autumn – Henri Matisse – to help us explore our ideas for some digital abstract art next week. In Geography, we learnt about the culture and traditions in Kenya. It was really interesting to see the similarities and differences between the UK and Kenya. Heading into our last week together! May the sun shine for us all!
Australasia (Year 3)	It's been a fabulous week for the children. They thoroughly enjoyed being part of the school production and playing their part in the chorus. Their efforts made a positive difference to the quality of the production as a whole. In class, the children really enjoyed exploring and investigating shapes. They made pull-up nets of a variety of 3D shapes so they better understand the concept of 3D and grasp the new terminology more readily. They also took part in an investigation and learnt the importance of careful and detailed recordings so they can prove their theories and spot patterns more readily. In computing, the children learnt about extensions and the importance of initialising before beginning programming. In English, they began to look at a short story animation. They reflected on how atmospheric decisions by the director can be replicated in writing.
Antarctica (Year 4)	After our exciting Year 4 Camp, the children have returned to the classroom this week and have enjoyed creating and sharing memories of their experiences in their personal review booklets. The children have really enjoyed researching, planning, baking and evaluating ideas for their tropical themed biscuits. The children worked brilliantly during these sessions and produced some excellent results which I hope you got the chance to taste. The big highlight of the week has been the Treasure Island production where the children give their all which I hope you enjoyed if you attended.
North America (Year 5)	We have reached the penultimate week of the year – another one that has flown by. The highlight could be none other than the fantastic KS2 Treasure Island production that the children played a fantastic part in. Beyond those, we had a busy week putting together our final compositions in art, with a link to collage. In computing, we experimented with programming to control LEDs and motors using Crumble kits. The children really enjoyed the practical putting the kits together as well as the problem solving aspect of debugging. In history, the children explored the changes that have taken place in music over the 20 <sup>th</sup> century, looking at how technology has influenced the way in which people experience music. One week to go!

South America (Year 6)	What a week!! The highlight definitely has to be the performances of our production Treasure Island. The children really pulled it together and were beyond amazing. There has been such a buzz of excitement all week and they are so proud of what they have achieved and so am I. In other news, we shared our maths games with year 5 which was great fun. We have been learning about healthy lifestyles in science and the impact of negative choices on the body. In RSHE we have learnt about healthy relationships and how to keep balance within a relationship and in computing we have finished our unit on micro:bits and been exploring different ways of coding
