

# We have been learning

Africa	This week in Africa class we have been listening to Stickman by Julia
(Year R)	Donaldson. This story has helped us start to think about the change of season, from Autumn towards Winter. This story was perfectly timed for the flurry of snow we received at playtime on Thursday! We have also made our own stick men, which we are very proud of. In Maths we have been looking at circles and triangles and how we can identify and describe them. In PE we have learning how to negotiate space whilst moving energetically. We have also been practising for our Christmas production and have really impressed everyone with how well we can learn the lyrics and the Makaton signs, we can't wait to show you in a couple of weeks.

Asia (Year 1)	This week we have been continuing our adventure in our magic box and writing instructions for flying. We have been learning all about bossy verbs and how to use them at the beginning of our sentences when writing instructions. In Maths we have been exploring 2D and 3D shapes, identifying their properties and going on shape hunts around the school. In PE we enjoyed our lesson with Coach Ben, learning about pencil jumps and different ways of travelling. On Wednesday we had our last drumming practise before our big concert next week – prepare to be wowed! We have also been spending lots of time learning our Christmas production songs. Only 2 weeks to go!!!
Europe (Year 2)	What a week full of fun we have had in Year 2 this week! In English, we have explored the use of the suffix -ing and -ed and used them to write some polar themed sentences. In maths, we started our exploration into multiplication by learning to recognise equal groups and looking at the two- and five-times table. In science, we gathered data in the woods and recorded our findings in a pictogram to help us answer the question 'Do all minibeasts like living in the same microhabitat?' Christmas Nativity rehearsals are creeping in too and we are loving it!
Australasia (Year 3)	We learnt so much this week! We learnt how to calculate using the column addition method (no exchanges yet). We learnt how writers add adverbs and action to add feeling and clarity to dialogue and explored what we mean by the 'subject' of a sentence. This was to help us write accurately and support us to improve sentence construction. In geography we looked at why people chose to settle in certain places and we reflected on what features we would look for if we were creating a Bronze age settlement from scratch. In RSHE we looked at healthy families and in art we explored different types of charcoal pencils/vines and different grips. We wanted to know which grip gives the greatest amount of control. In PE we explored dribbling and we also learnt a little about street dance and 'tutting'.
Antarctica (Year 4)	It has been a busy week in Year 4 as always. We have continued with multiplication with a focus on using the formal written method. In English, we have enjoyed reading the story of Leon and the place in between and developing our predicting and vocabulary skills. We have produced some excellent descriptive writing using expanded noun and adverbial phrases. In history, we have explored and designed Greek vases and in computing we have tried to record our first discussions using the audio app. In PE, we have continued to develop our use of space and movement in basketball and create fluent sequences in gymnastics. In music, we are learning to play and perform a tune on the glockenspiel. In RSHE, we have had good discussions about relationships and who our important people in our lives are and how we connect with them.
North America (Year 5)	We started the week with a great gymnastics session with Coach Ben, perfecting our balances, rolls and jumps as well as introducing a straddle. In English, we've thought about improving details and description to our narratives as well as writing an effective resolution. We moved onto our final operation in maths, division, thinking carefully about the process of exchanging whilst using the short division method. In art, the children had an opportunity to sketch the foreground of an unknown planet and in computing, we practised using different filming techniques on iPads linked to our new unit on video production.

South	Another busy week in South America. In maths, we have learnt about how to
