Dear Parents and Carers,

Welcome back to the new half term everyone. I trust you all had a good week and enjoyed time with your children. We continue to focus on our termly Rudgwick value of **Belief** this term and we talked in assembly on Monday about the importance of self-belief and **confidence** (our other value of focus for this half term) in ourselves. The power of 'yet' is vital to the children's attitude to learning, if there are challenges for them they should take the approach that they, perhaps, can't do something...yet! But with effort, determination and perseverance, they will. Do remind your children that they are superstars who have no limits on what they can achieve!

They have started the half term with that self-belief and confidence in so many aspects of the curriculum and beyond.

Reception Class and Year 6 have begun working with Coach Ben from Sports Stars UK in PE and have engaged in the sporting challenges he has set.



As part of their 'People Who Help Us' topic, Year 1 were visited by Sarah, a nurse from Brighton Hospital. She talked to them about her job and about how nurses help us when we are unwell. The children showed the confidence to listen carefully and ask lots of interesting questions which our visitor was happy to answer. The class got to take home a wrist band with their name on and a book all about staying in a hospital.









And our Sports Leaders' lunchtime football tournament came to a climax this week as the finals were played. A winning team from each of the three Houses took part in a final league tournament which led to the last game, between Kestrels Team 2 and Eagles Team 2 being a 'winner-takes-all' match. ## We have been learning

Africa	It is lovely to see everyone well and back at school after the half-term
(Year R)	break! This week we have begun to think about different communities and places in the village of Rudgwick. We have learnt that there used to be dinosaurs in Rudgwick and been excited to discover facts about them. In Woodland Learning we had a scavenger hunt, looking for different types of leaves, rocks and feathers. In Maths, we have been measuring each other and items around the classroom with rulers, meter sticks, tapes measures, cubes and even with our feet! We also met Coach Ben for PE this week. He will be teaching us ball skills this half-term. This week we got to practise

	some rugby ball skills; Coach Ben was very impressed with our listening skills
	and technique.
Asia (Year 1)	What a great start to the half term we've had with not one but two visitors as part of our People Who Help Us topic. On Tuesday we were visited by a
	paediatric nurse who told us all about her job and how she helps us if we are poorly. We then wrote fact pages about the role of a nurse as the first page of
	our People Who Help Us books. On Tuesday we also had a visit from Southern Water who talked to us about saving water. She gave us lots of ideas for how
	we can save water at home and at school – including turning the tap off when brushing your teeth. Thank you to Ruby and Sarah Matthews for our talks. In Maths we have been exploring measure, using non standard measurements
	before progressing to using a ruler accurately. In Art we have been learning about the work of Andy Warhol and the types of colours he used.
Europe	Welcome back, this term we are learning all about plants and growing. We
(Year 2)	started the week by exploring the school grounds looking for signs of Spring! Amazingly, the children found quite a few different types of flowers and a bird's
	nest. In science we began to design and set up a test to find out what plants need to stay healthy. We have also started to look at the book The Curious Garden by Peter Brown and have used adjectives to describe the scene at the
	beginning of the story. In maths we have been using different vocabulary to describe 3D shapes. In music we learnt to create our own four beat patterns
	and then listen to and copy ones our friends had composed.
Australasia (Year 3)	Welcome back! This half term, we are continuing with our Roman topic and reading 'Escape from Pompeii'. We were very grateful to River for bringing in some fascinating artefacts that were found on his farmland or close to and we
	learnt that his drive cuts through the Roman Road of Stane Street. We have also started woodland learning which the children love and they thoroughly
	enjoyed their scavenger hunt, looking for things that began with the letters of the alphabet. There were very creative with adjectives to help with the more
	obscure letters! In Maths, we have started looking at measure and the relationship between mm, cm and m. We began looking at the work of Megan Coyle in art and looked at landscapes using collage instead of painting. A busy time was had by all!
Antarctica	Welcome back, A busy start to our next half term with lots of new learning
(Year 4)	already underway. In English, we have looked at how to write and present a news report online and have written our own based on the Battle of Bosworth.
	In Maths, we have learnt how to classify and organise shapes according to their properties. A new topic has begun in history with the Tudors and how they came to the throne of England. In PE, new units are underway with dance and
	orienteering which the children have enjoyed. The children are making great progress with their playing of the clarinet and are now beginning to learn some
	different tunes. In art, the children have been exploring how to adapt a photograph using different effects.
North America	We are back! This week has flown by with all of our learning that's gotten under way. In maths, we have started thinking about area and perimeter of
(Year 5)	squares and rectangles, as well as using this knowledge for composite shapes. In English, the children have edited the first part of their narratives linked to Beowulf and have written a first draft of a fight scope with the sea-
	linked to Beowulf and have written a first draft of a fight scene with the sea- hag using powerful vocabulary. We looked at the events that led up to the Battle of Hastings and who the multiple claimants to the throne were when
	King Edward the Confessor died. The children created records for a paper database as part of our new computing unit. The children chose different to
	file a record using multiple fields for which they could use to sort and order

	their database. We had a great time getting back out for woodland learning and in DT we discussed what a mechanism is before looking at how levers function.
South America (Year 6)	And we're into the second half of the year!! What a week back we have had. In maths, we have been learning about algebra and finding unknowns in an equation. In English, we have been writing our narratives and thinking about including dialogue for a purpose; either to advance the action or to convey a character. In science, we have continued learning about fossils and thought about what we can learn from them as palaeontologists and in geography we have thought about different types of weathering and saw how they can affect our landscape. We have also started a new computing topic, where we are learning about variables in games using scratch. We have learnt how to create our own variable and apply it to a simple game. Finally, on Tuesday we started our PE sessions with coach Ben. He will be teaching us gymnastics each week this half term.
