We have been learning

Africa (Year R)	What an amazing week we have had in Africa class! Everyone is so proud of how well we performed during our first sports day at Rudgwick Primary! We showed everyone just how confident, focused and respectful we all are. We all loved the picnic with our parents and cheering for our houses. Our class caterpillars have now all entered their cocoons, so we are now eagerly awaiting the appearance of the butterflies. We have ended the week with lots of water and bubble play outside. We even managed to get Mr Ryan covered in bubbles!
Asia (Year 1)	We are another week closer to the end of term and the weeks seem to be flying by. We were so proud of the whole class for their amazing effort and focus during sports day - it was a very long day for them. In Literacy we have continued with our fact files, this time researching and writing about our chosen animal's diet and family. In maths we have continued to explore time, learning to read and write half past as well as using our knowledge of time to create our own daily timetable. In Geography we used our knowledge of hot and cold countries to create a packing list for an imaginary holiday, thinking carefully about the clothes and equipment we might need for the weather. We loved having a whole afternoon of woodland learning on Tuesday where we built dens, created clay hedgehogs and had a go at whittling.
Europe (Year 2)	A warmer week in school and we made the most of it with all our PE and fabulous sports day efforts! The children all worked so brilliantly and their efforts in each of their races, were fantastic! Well done everyone! In English, we have been exploring with rhyme and have written our own rhyming poems. It was certainly a challenge, but we tried very hard! In maths, we reviewed our multiplication and division facts and in science we learnt about the scientist Jacques Cousteau – why not ask your child about him? In geography, we discovered the 'Big Five' in terms of African animals living in Kenya and used iPads to research them. In DT, we have finally decided the ice cream flavours we are going to make and wrote recipes for them. We absolutely can't wait to make our own ice cream!
Australasia (Year 3)	In maths we have been learning to the tell time to the minute and to use a digital clock and convert digital times to analogue times and vice versa. In English we learnt about subordinate clauses and used them in our writing. In RE, we researched ambassadors for faiths and what these ambassadors have personally done to make the world a better place. We decided our Top Trump Ambassador for a religion. In RSHE, we developed our understanding of a range of feelings and learnt that people's bodies always communicating - even without words. We reflected on what this means for us and how we can use this learning.
